The mangbetu whose sculptures and potteries are famous in the UELE-ITURI region, even beyond to the West, were involuntarily locked in a region over-saturated with various ethnic groups as elsewhere along the old colonial borders . Even today, the nations of Africa, through hundreds of ethnicities and sub-ethnicities straddling their borders, are constantly suffering from the Berlin Wall syndrome.
