In UELE-ITURI, the Mangbetu are renowned for their 30 cm RAKU pottery and sculptures, which have gained popularity extending beyond the region to the West. The Mangbetu people found themselves living in an area rich with various ethnic groups due to the historical colonial borders. Today, African nations, with numerous ethnic and sub-ethnic groups spanning their borders, continue to experience the Berlin Wall syndrome. This often results in ethnic conflicts driven not solely by territorial disputes but by political, economic, and religious ideologies, for which the West bears clear responsibilities in this era of globalization.
